# A GUIDE TO USING SINGULAR THEY/THEM PRONOUNS



## WHAT ARE SINGULAR THEY/THEM PRONOUNS?

Pronouns are words that are used in place of nouns. Third person pronouns are used to refer to other people. In English, she/her and he/him are common third person singular pronouns. They/them can also be used as third person singular pronouns that do not specify the gender of the person being discussed.

#### WHEN DO WE USE THEY/THEM PRONOUNS?

They/them pronouns are often used as a gender neutral alternative to she/her and he/him pronouns. They are often preferred by nonbinary people who do not identify as men or women. If someone has expressed that they use they/them pronouns, you should respect that (See "A Guide to Not Misgendering Trans People"). If you don't know what pronouns someone uses, you can use they/them pronouns until you find out.

### ARE THEY/THEM PRONOUNS UNGRAMMATICAL?

Nope! Most people already use they/them pronouns when they do not know someone's gender or when their gender is irrelevant. For example: "I accidentally cut someone off in traffic, I hope **they** aren't mad!"

#### **HOW TO USE 3RD PERSON SINGULAR PRONOUNS**

He	Him	His	Himself	<b>He</b> is talking. I hear <b>him</b> . That bag is <b>his</b> . He made it <b>himself</b> .
She	Her	Her	Herself	<b>She</b> is talking. I hear <b>her</b> . That bag is <b>hers</b> . She made it <b>herself</b> .
They	Them	Their	Themself	<b>They</b> are talking. I hear <b>them</b> . That bag is <b>theirs</b> . They made it <b>themself</b> .
